

# PCC CANDIDATES BRIEFING INFORMATION

# **COMMUNITY RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN**

Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire Authority (see below for further detail), has a legal duty to:

- Identify and assess all foreseeable fire and rescue related risks that could affect the county of Nottinghamshire;
- Put in place appropriate measures to reduce those risks.

This is done through the Community Risk Management Plan (CRMP), within which is an outline of the long-term ambition for the Service, which provides the context for this three-year plan.

To develop the CRMP, a Strategic Assessment of Risk (SAoR) was put in place, which considered political, economic, socio-cultural, technological, environmental, legal and organisational factors.

Current fire cover arrangements for attending fire and rescue incidents were also analysed and, from the findings of the SAoR, strategic goals for the next three years were then developed, along with the actions needed to deliver them.

The current CRMP covers the period from April 2022 through to March 2025. For each of these three years, the Service publishes an Annual Delivery Plan. Each year's plan drives the day-to-day activities of the Service. The annual plans include key performance indicators, so the Service can see how it is doing. At the end of each year, progress and performance is reported in an Annual Statement of Assurance.
